Research Colleges

How?

- Make a list of what is most important to you (size, location, degree plan, cost, etc.)
- ⇒ Research:
 - → College Websites
 - Online Info Sessions
 - Virtual or Physical College Tours

Each Senior is allowed 2 college visits during the school year. You must complete and turn in a College Visit Form to your counselor BEFORE going!

Begin the Application Process

Application Systems

- ⇒ ApplyTexas.org
 - → For public Texas colleges & universities and trade schools
- □ CommonApp.org and The Coalition Application
 - For private and out-of-state colleges & universities and many Texas colleges and universities.

THS Counselors and TC representatives will work with English 4 classes on September 8th to help students apply.

Due Dates

- Early decision and early action applications are typically due in October and November. Be sure to check your deadlines!
- Many regular admissions applications are due December 1st with other schools deadline between January 1 and March 1.

Begin the Application Process

When you apply...

- Complete ALL of the application including the scholarship part (if applicable)
- ⇒ Save as you go!
- ⇒ Pay the application fee (if you receive free/reduced lunch, email <u>Mrs.</u>
 <u>Hortenstine</u> for a waiver)
- ⇒ Send a transcript <u>Mrs. Zucknick, THS Registrar</u> can help with this.
- ⇒ Send ACT and/or SAT Scores you must request these scores through the ACT and College Board websites.
- ⇒ Send TSIA2 scores email Mrs. Hortenstine for a copy of your scores.

College / Career Readiness

- All students must be "college / career ready" before graduating.
- Student's can achieve college readiness with SAT, ACT or TSIA2 and with Industry
 Based Certifications through our welding, healthcare, culinary, automotive, floral design, programs.

NEXT STEP: TEXAS SUCCESS INITIATIVE (TSIA2)


The TSI Assessment is part of the Texas Success Initiative program.

If you are an incoming college student in Texas, you are required to take the TSI Assessment - unless you are already exempt (see chart)

-to determine if you are ready for college-level course work in the areas of reading, writing, and mathematics.

<u>Based on how you perform, you may either:</u>

- 1) be enrolled in a college-level course and/or
- 2) be placed in the appropriate developmental course or intervention to improve your skills and prepare you for success in college-level courses.

TSI Math Prep Class

Great opportunity to improve your math skills to prepare for college and career!

This class will "fill in the gaps" students missed during Covid.

If/when you go to college / trade school, if you do not hit the TSI / College Readiness benchmarks you will have to take developmental math classes which costs you MONEY and TIME.

The TSI Math Prep Class is FREE and in high-school, and counts as your 4th math - THIS IS A GREAT OPPORTUNITY!

We need ALL our students to be College and CAREER ready!

Additional Application Requirements

⇒ Letters of Recommendation

- → Begin identifying potential recommenders
- If required: Colleges typically want letters from teachers of academic subjects (core and language) who know you best
- If optional: Student can usually ask for a letter from a coach, program director, elective teacher, employer, etc but not from a family member
 It's a good idea to include letters of rec even if they are optional.
 - It's one more way you can tell colleges more about you!
- Complete a <u>Student Brag Sheet</u> and give it to the teachers, counselor, and/or principal you are requesting the letter from.
- Always ask teachers first, in person (if possible), and write a "Thank You" note later
- → Give your recommender at least two weeks advance notice.

Additional Application Requirements

⇒ Essays

- Optional essays aren't really optional. Many colleges use essays to make admission decisions. It can mean the difference between being accepted and being denied.
- Be sure your voice comes through your essay should sound like you
- Tell a story or share an insight on how something impacted your life (what you learned and why) that cannot be picked up on from your application or resume – Applicants are more than their GPA and test scores
- → It's okay to be creative
- College admissions representatives read thousands of essays a year,
 so strive to make yours memorable

Additional Application Requirements

⇒ Resumes

- → It should highlight accomplishments and or activities not shown (or elaborated on) in the application
- → Be concise; the resume should not be more than two pages
- → Be sure to explain activities that might be unique to Taylor High School
- → For ApplyTexas, your child likely will need to upload into the Go Apply Texas portal as he/she is submitting the application)
- For CommonApp, resumes are uploaded as part of the application

What influences admission decisions?

- Class Rank: In the state of Texas, the top 10 percent of the senior class gets automatic admission to any public university (University of Texas is top 6%)
- ⇒ Transcript: GPA and grades
 - Did the student challenge himself in subjects of interest and aptitude?
 - This does NOT mean that all courses should be PreAP and/or AP
 - Do her electives reflect interests she already has or show that she has been exploring possible interests?
- ⇒ Standardized Test Scores (SAT and ACT) However, some colleges are not requiring these scores for 2023 admission
- Resume or list of activities
- ⇒ Essays
 - These can reveal the applicant's personality and suggest how he or she might fit in and contribute to the campus culture
- Overall, they are looking for authenticity who are you and why do you want to attend their college?
- Recommendation Letters when they add to something to the application

Family Contributions

- Talk to your parents!
- Fill out <u>FAFSA Calculator</u> to get an estimate of your EFC (Expected Family Contribution)
- Do the math! Cost of school EFC = What You Need



Scholarships & Grants

- Scholarships & Grants are FREE MONEY!
- Scholarships are usually merit-based or needs-based.
- Grants are need-based.
- Taylor High School Scholarship Website
 - THS Local Scholarships sponsored by Taylor area businesses / organizations or former students or in memory of former students. In 2022, there were over 70 local scholarships valued over \$120,000 awarded to THS seniors.
 - Outside Area Scholarships National Scholarship search engines as well as outside scholarships sent to notify our seniors. Most submitted directly to the scholarship organization.

- Federal & Private Loans
- Loans must be paid back on time!
- Complete the FAFSA online Opens October 1

What you can do this summer...

⇒ Outline your financial aid plan

- → Use the financial aid calculators found on individual college websites
- → Create a list of all the financial aid options you plan to pursue along with the deadlines for each.

⇒ Apply for traditional scholarships

- → Many seniors apply to more than 30 scholarships
- → Don't shy away from local options or ones that require essays. Since fewer students apply for these, you often have a better chance.
- → Begin applying between junior and senior year and continue throughout the school year
- → Most local scholarships open to seniors in the spring

ASVAB Test

ASVAB stands for Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB). Regardless of which branch of the military you are interested in, you must take the ASVAB.

The ASVAB is a timed, multiple choice test, that helps to determine whether you are a good fit to join the service, but also which service branch you might be best for and even what military jobs you can hold after you finish basic training or boot camp. The better your ASVAB score, the broader your options.

You can start preparing now by taking free online ASVAB practice tests.

Each branch of the U.S. military has its own minimum standards when it comes to the ASVAB scores. The highest score that anyone can earn on the ASVAB is 99.

- Army 31
- Marine Corps 32
- Navy 35
- Air Force 36
- Coast Guard 40

You will have the opportunity to take the ASVAB here at school starting your junior year.

COLLEGE & MILITARY

There are 2 main ways that students can get their college education before going into the military.

Those 2 methods are ROTC and Service Academies.

ALL branches of the military HIGHLY encourage all of their enlisted service members to take college classes and continue their education while they are serving their military contracts.

FIND OUT MORE

All branches of the US Military have websites where you can find out more information.

If you are interested in a military career after high school, you can start seriously talking to a recruiter your junior year.
